PRINCESS RECORDER – PLEASE ANNOUNCE THIS AT YOUR NEXT STATED SESSION, RETAIN A COPY IN THE TEMPLE RECORDS, AND DISTRIBUTE A COPY TO EVERY TEMPLE MEMBER.

To Her Supreme Majesty, Past Supreme Queens, Supreme Elective Officers, Supreme Appointive Officers, Supreme Appointees, Reigning Queens, Past Queens, and Ladies of the Household:

Attached you will find the Legislation Results from Supreme Session 2026 – Victoria, British Columbia, including changes to the Supreme Temple Bylaws, Subordinate Temple Bylaws, Manual of Procedures, and Ritual.

ANNUAL SUPREME SESSION 2026 – VICTORIA, BRITISH COLUMBIA

LEGISLATION RESULTS FOR THE SUPREME TEMPLE BYLAWS, SUBORDINATE TEMPLE BYLAWS, MANUAL OF PROCEDURES, RITUAL, AND CODE OF CONDUCT

Please be aware of the changes made to the Supreme Temple, Daughters of the Nile, Supreme Temple and Subordinate Temple Bylaws 2013.7 versions by the voting Delegates and changes to the Ritual and Manual of Procedures at the Supreme Temple Annual Board Meeting by the Board of Directors in Victoria, British Columbia. These changes were effective as of the day adopted. They are all in effect now.

Please keep for your reference a copy of these legislative and Supreme Temple publication updates in all Temple-owned and personal copies of the Supreme Temple Bylaws PART I, Subordinate Temple Bylaws PART II, Manual of Procedures, Ritual, and Code of Conduct until published printed replacement Sections are available from the Office of the Supreme Princess Recorder pro tem.

PART I SUPREME TEMPLE BYLAWS AMENDMENTS

Amendment V-1 to PART I, ARTICLE I, SOVEREIGNTY AND ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE, SECTION 2. Supreme Temple Elective Officers, as adopted now reads:

- A. The Elective Officers of the Supreme Temple shall be Her Supreme Majesty, the Supreme Queen; Supreme Princess Royal; Supreme Princess Tirzah; Supreme Princess Badoura; Supreme Princess Recorder; and Supreme Princess Banker; who shall be the Executive Committee.
- B. No Supreme Temple Elective Officer may simultaneously serve as an Elective Officer of a Subordinate Temple.

Amendment V-2 to PART I, ARTICLE I, SOVEREIGNTY AND ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE, SECTION 4. Supreme Temple Membership. B., as adopted now reads:

- A. Membership in the Supreme Temple shall be the voting Delegates.

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- B. These Voting Delegates shall be: Past Supreme Queens, Supreme Temple Elective Officers, Supreme Temple Appointive Officers, Subordinate Temple Elective Officers, Past Queens, and five (5) Ladies of the Household Delegates from each of the Subordinate Temples.

Amendment V-3 to PART I, ARTICLE II, SUPREME TEMPLE BOARD OF DIRECTORS, SECTION 1. Authority and Duties, as adopted now reads:

- F. Elect annually, a Canadian member to serve as a Canadian Office Assistant to the Supreme Princess Recorder to receive and deposit all funds from Canadian Members for Per Capita, Insurance, Supreme Temple publications, and such other amounts due to the Supreme Temple, Daughters of the Nile, and to administer such other tasks as may be assigned by the Supreme Temple Board of Directors.

Amendment V-4 to PART I, ARTICLE III, SUPREME ELECTIVE OFFICERS, SECTION 5. Supreme Princess Recorder, 2. Executive Assistants. a., was defeated.

Amendment V-5 to PART I, ARTICLE III, SECTION 5. Supreme Princess Recorder, E. Supreme Princess Recorder's Allocation, Assistants, and Term Limits, 2. Executive Assistants, as adopted now reads:

- c. The Canadian Office Assistant shall receive a stipend of fourteen dollars (US \$14) per hour not to exceed seven hundred fifty dollars (US \$750) per month.

Amendment V-6 to PART I, ARTICLE III. SECTION 7. Election of Officers, as adopted now reads:

A Résumé, as described in Section 4. below, for any Supreme Elective Office shall stand on its own merit and shall not include a cover letter.

Amendment V-7 to PART I, ARTICLE III, SUPREME TEMPLE ELECTIVE OFFICERS, SECTION 7. Election of Officers, as adopted now reads:

SECTION 7. Election of Officers

Campaigning for or against any candidate shall not be permitted and could result in suspension or expulsion.

Amendment V-8 to PART I, ARTICLE III, SUPREME TEMPLE ELECTIVE OFFICERS, SECTION 7, Election of Officers, B. Supreme Princess Recorder and/or Supreme Princess Banker. 2. and 5., as adopted now reads:

- B. Supreme Princess Recorder and/or Supreme Princess Banker**
2. After receiving an affirmative majority vote supporting her candidacy by her Subordinate Temple, a Member desiring to be a candidate shall submit a Résumé of her interpersonal attributes, , teamwork and leadership experience, and required qualifications.
 5. h. For Supreme Princess Recorder, prior experience as a Princess Recorder is required.
 - i. For Supreme Princess Banker, prior experience as a Princess Banker is required.

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Amendment V-9 to PART I, ARTICLE IV, SUPREME TEMPLE COMMITTEES, SECTION L. Jurisprudence Committee, as adopted now reads:

L. Jurisprudence Committee shall be composed of one (1) Past Supreme Queen to serve as Chair, two (2) Past Supreme Queens, and a minimum of two (2) additional members.

Amendment V-10 to PART I, ARTICLE V, SUPREME ORGANIZERS-AT-LARGE, SUPREME DEPUTY ORGANIZERS, SUPREME AMBASSADORS-AT-LARGE, SUPREME GOODWILL AMBASSADORS, SECTION 4. Supreme Goodwill Ambassadors, as adopted now reads:

A Supreme Goodwill Ambassador shall be a member of Daughters of the Nile, promote membership participation, serve as liaison to the Supreme Ambassador-at-Large, and perform such other duties as promote the harmony of the Order.

Amendment V-11 to PART I, Article VII, SECTION 4. FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY, D. as adopted now reads:

SECTION 4. Financial Responsibility

D. At the conclusion of the Annual Supreme Session, after all loans and expenses are paid and the books are closed, the Supreme Temple will retain fifty percent (50%) of the proceeds, and the Host Temple will retain fifty percent (50%) of the proceeds.

Amendment V-12 to PART I, ARTICLE VII, SUPREME TEMPLE ANNUAL SESSION, SECTION 5. A. Registration as adopted now reads:

SECTION 5. Registration

- A. A Registration fee shall be paid to the Hostess Temple.
1. US members and other International members shall remit one hundred ten dollars (\$110) in US Funds.
 2. Canadian members shall remit one hundred ten dollars (\$110) in Canadian Funds.
 3. Members from all other International Temples shall remit an amount determined by a mathematical formula derived from calculating the current value of the foreign currency compared to the US dollar and adjusting it dependent upon the median income of the International country to determine the fair registration fee.
 4. Such calculation shall be completed prior to the publication of the Annual Supreme Session Packet each year.

AMENDMENT V-13 to PART I, ARTICLE VII, SUPREME TEMPLE ANNUAL SESSION, SECTION 9. Legislation, 4. as adopted now reads:

4. The Chair, the Jurisprudence Committee, and the Supreme Temple Registered Parliamentarian may edit Bylaw Amendments, provided the purpose is not altered and only with the proposer's consultation and agreement.

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AMENDMENT V-14 to PART I, ARTICLE VIII, SECTION 9. D. 1. as adopted now reads:

1. Adoption requires a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Delegates present and voting. Any amendment to a proposed Bylaw amendment shall require the same vote as required for adoption, which in the Supreme Temple Bylaws requires adoption by a two-thirds (2/3) majority.

AMENDMENT V-15 to PART II, ARTICLE II, MEMBERSHIP, SECTION 1. B. Eligibility as adopted now reads:

- A. Eligibility to membership in a Temple shall be open to all women of good character who are eighteen (18) years of age or older and:
 1. Is related by birth or marriage to a Shriner, Master Mason, or Daughter of the Nile, or
 2. Is a Majority Member in Good Standing of a Masonic-related organization for girls, or
 3. Who was a patient, with or without Shrine or Masonic relationship, at a Shriners Hospitals for Children® facility, or
 4. A close and trusted friend of a Daughter of the Nile whose desire is to advance the philanthropy of Daughters of the Nile.
- B. The Proposal for Membership shall be signed and submitted by two (2) members in Good Standing who are well acquainted with and will vouch for the woman. In locations where proposing a close and trusted friend is restricted by local Masonic Code, the Proposal shall also be signed by two (2) Shriners in good standing, who will vouch for her character.
- C. A woman may become a member of any Daughters of the Nile Temple.

AMENDMENT V-16 to PART II, ARTICLE II, MEMBERSHIP, SECTION 13. as adopted now reads:

SECTION 13. Dropped Members

Any member or Life Member whose Annual Dues and/or annual Per Capita are absorbed or remitted by a Home Subordinate Temple and who cannot be contacted or located for three (3) consecutive years by the Princess Recorder or the Membership Committee, using the last known contact information of the member, may be dropped from active Membership in Daughters of the Nile by a majority vote of the Subordinate Temple. This would include Life Members, Remits, and Closed Temple Transfers.

SECTION 15. Non-Denominational, Memorial, or Burial Services for Members.

If a Member is dropped because of loss of contact, her Temple shall still conduct a Daughters of the Nile Non-Denominational, Memorial, or Burial Service if in her Will or if requested by her family.

AMENDMENT V-17 to PART II, ARTICLE III, FINANCE, A. was deferred to the 2027 Annual Supreme Session.

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AMENDMENT V-18 to PART II, ARTICLE V, SECTION 1. ELECTIVE OFFICERS, B. as adopted now reads:

B. By virtue of her service as Queen, the Junior Past Queen shall be a Temple Officer. She shall complete her year as Junior Past Queen to be eligible for a Life Membership.

AMENDMENT V-19 to PART II, ARTICLE V, OFFICERS, SECTION 3. Assistant to Officers as adopted now reads:

- A. ONLY a Daughter of the Nile shall be allowed to assist any Officer.
- B. Princess Recorder and/or Princess Banker Assistant.
 - 1. The Assistant Recorder or Assistant Banker may hold another office and provide assistance outside of Stated Sessions.
 - 2. These assistants may also be assigned responsibilities related to the technological aspects of the offices, including assisting with online computer programs or electronic systems used by the Supreme and Subordinate Temples.

AMENDMENT V-20 to PART II, ARTICLE VII, SUBORDINATE TEMPLE SESSIONS, SECTION 1. A. 4. as adopted shall read:

- 4. With a vote of the Temple, a Queen may elect to hold up to two (2) virtual Sessions during the fiscal year. These Sessions shall count toward the required nine (9) Stated Sessions. These virtual Sessions may be held with respect to the cases listed in 3. above or simply scheduled in advance as an alternative meeting format.

AMENDMENT V-21 to PART II, ARTICLE VII, SECTION 1. SUBORDINATE TEMPLE SESSIONS, SECTION 1. Stated Sessions, B. 2. as adopted shall read:

- B. **Founders Day – October 30** shall be observed at the October or November Stated Session, whichever Stated Session falls closest to October 30.
 - 2. The tribute shall honor the Founders of our Order and may include the reading of the **PROCLAMATION** on Pages 7-8 of the Ritual.

AMENDMENT V-22 to PART I, ARTICLE VII, SUPREME TEMPLE ANNUAL SESSION, SECTION 7. Temple Delegates and Votes. B. as adopted shall read:

- B. Each Subordinate Temple may elect up to five (5) Ladies of the Household Delegates as defined in the Supreme Temple Bylaws, Part I, Article I, Section 4.

With advance notice, election(s) of the Delegates shall be prior to the closing of the Annual Supreme Session Registration at one or more Stated/Special Sessions.

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AMENDMENT V-23 to PART II, ARTICLE VII, SUBORDINATE TEMPLE SESSIONS, SECTION 1. Stated Session as adopted shall read:

D. Change in Session Date, Time and/or Place.

1. The Temple may, by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present at a Stated Session, set a different date, time, and/or location for any future Stated Session(s). All members must be notified in writing of the change(s).
2. No Temple shall hold a Stated/Special Session five (5) days prior to, five (5) days after, or during the week of the Supreme Temple Annual Session.
3. A Stated Session falling within fifteen (15) days prior to or after the Official Visit of the Supreme Queen may be combined with the Special Session for the Office Visit.

CHANGES TO THE RITUAL

Abbreviated Closing, Page 85:

Between the OPTIONAL CLOSING ODE and Princess Tirzah attending the Altar, add back:

Q. – I will ask a favor of you – that you be as faithful and punctual in your attendance at the Temple as your other duties will permit.

Supreme Temple Ceremonies, Page 123:

Delete the last sentence in the small print at the bottom of the page to read:

She gives the password to the Supreme Lady of the Keys and then takes her seat in the Temple.

The entire paragraph now reads:

(A member desiring to enter while Temple is in session shows her Registration Badge and Dues card to the Supreme Lady of the Gates. She gives the password to the Supreme Lady of the Keys and then takes her seat in the Temple.)

CHANGES TO THE MANUAL OF PROCEDURES

Article VI. Duties of Officers, G. Princess Recorder, 20. Minutes – Reading

As minutes should be fully shared with the Members, ~~delete~~ a., ii, iii, and iv. which read:

- b. Minutes may be sent to the membership electronically. ii. Information regarding the finances of the Temple shall be redacted., iii. Information about Proposals, balloting on previous Proposals, and Petitions received shall be redacted, iv. The information NOT to be shared electronically may be included on a page(s) separate from the remainder of the Minutes; the information may be blacked out electronically; or a scan of the Minutes may be blacked out and scan distributed.

Add New Definitions:

1. A **Life Member** is a Member whose Home Temple voted to pay her Annual Dues and Annual Per Capita for her lifetime.
2. An **Affiliate Life Member** is a Member whose Home Temple closed, and the Affiliate Temple voted to pay her Dues for her lifetime.

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Add instructions for handling Standing Rules for Subordinate Temples:

- Standing Rules relate to the administrative or operational details of a Temple (e.g., meeting logistics, reimbursement policies, and use of technology).
- They do not affect parliamentary procedures or the rights of members as those belong in the Bylaws.
- Standing Rules may be adopted by a majority vote at a Session and may be amended or rescinded by a majority vote with previous notice or by a two-thirds (2/3) vote without previous notice.

1. Moving a Bylaw into a Standing Rule

Step 1: Draft wording to remove from Bylaws and wording of the new Standing Rule.

Step 2: Provide proper written notice as required by the Bylaws.

Step 3: Present two (2) motions:

- Motion A: Amend Bylaws to strike or modify the section.
- Motion B: Adopt the new Standing Rules with replacement wording.

Step 4: Vote thresholds

- Bylaw amendment – two-thirds (2/3) vote
- Standing Rule adoption – majority vote

Sample Motions:

Motion A: Bylaw Amendment – “I move to amend the Bylaws by striking Article ____, Section ____.”

Motion B: Standing Rule Adoption – “I move that we adopt the following standing rule [insert text].”

2. Creating a New Standing Rule

Motion: “I move to adopt the following Standing Rule [text].”

Vote required: Majority

3. Changing an Existing Standing Rule

With previous notice – Majority vote.

Without previous notice – Two-thirds (2/3) vote.

Suspend for one (1) meeting – Two-thirds (2/3) vote.

4. Supreme Temple Approval

Send the adopted Bylaw (or revised Bylaw) to the Supreme Temple Bylaws of Subordinate Temples Committee for approval per the Bylaw approval process.

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Add a Section on Virtual Sessions

X. Virtual Sessions

A. Purpose

1. Virtual Stated or Special Sessions may be held electronically in accordance with Supreme Temple Bylaws, Part II, Article VII, Section 1.A. for the orderly transaction of necessary Temple business.

B. Authorization and Notice

1. A Virtual Stated or Special Session may be held electronically with notice to all Members.
2. Notice may be given by email or any other practicable method and shall include the date, time, electronic platform, access instructions, and any information necessary to join the Session.
3. The Supreme Queen and Supreme Princess Recorder shall be notified of the Virtual Session.

C. Host Responsibilities

1. A Member with sufficient knowledge of the electronic meeting platform (such as Zoom or similar application) shall serve as Host and shall manage the technical operation of the Session.
2. The host shall take reasonable steps to ensure that only Members in Good Standing are admitted to the Session.
3. A visiting Member shall communicate with the Host in advance and shall provide or display her current Dues Card electronically.

D. Member Requirements

1. All participants should be able to hear one another. If visual participation is available, Members should also be visible when practicable.
2. If a Member joins by telephone without video capability, she shall announce her name when recognized. Additionally, her name should be readily seen at the bottom of the screen.
3. No Member shall participate in a Virtual Session while driving a vehicle. The Host shall immediately disconnect any Member who appears to be driving.
4. While the Session is open, Members shall mute microphones except when speaking.
5. Recording the Session by any participant is prohibited unless specifically authorized by the Temple.
6. The Princess Recorder shall note the Officers and Members present and shall prepare the Minutes in the usual manner.
7. Members electronically present and able to hear the proceedings shall be counted for the purpose of establishing a Quorum.
8. The Queen shall wear the Temple Crown, if available.

E. Ritual

1. No Ritualistic Opening or Closing shall be used, except as otherwise provided in this section.

F. Order of Business

1. The order of business for a Virtual Session shall be:

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- a. The Queen shall call the Session to order and instruct Members regarding microphone muting and speaking procedures or may request the Host to give such instructions.
 - b. Introductions are unnecessary; however, if made, they shall be limited to Supreme Temple Officers and Past Supreme Queens.
 - c. The usual Order of Business shall then be followed as provided in the Manual of Procedures for Stated Session, to the extent applicable.
 - d. The Princess Chaplain, or the Queen, shall give a prayer. The prayer from the Ritual Opening or another suitable prayer may be used.
 - e. Voting on motions may be conducted in any practicable manner, including raised hands, electronic hand icon, poll feature, or similar method. The Host shall explain the method before the vote when necessary.
 - f. Balloting on Proposals requiring privacy shall be conducted as confidentially as practicable. Ballots may be cast by secure private electronic message, confidential email, electronic polling tool, or other method approved by the Queen. The Queen and Junior Past Queen shall supervise the count unless otherwise provided. Results shall be entered into the Minutes.
 - g. An Obligation Only Ceremony may be held only if permitted by Supreme Temple Bylaws.
 - h. The Princess Chaplain, or the Queen, shall give the Ritualistic Closing prayer or another suitable prayer.
 - i. The Queen shall declare the Virtual Session closed.
- G. Technical Difficulties
- 1. If technical difficulties substantially impair the ability of Members to participate, the Queen may recess, postpone, adjourn, or take such other action as is appropriate.
- H. Parliamentary Authority
- 1. All rules governing Stated or Special Session shall apply to Virtual Sessions unless inconsistent with this section.

Changes to Code of Conduct

Page C-4, I. DISCIPLINARY JURISDICTION AUTHORITY, add B.3. to read:

- 3. The Supreme Temple Code of Conduct procedures shall be initiated when a charge is made against a Supreme Temple Elective Officer for failure to perform the duties of her office.

Page C-5, II. Code of Conduct Offenses, add B.6. to read:

- 6. Add new 6. (and renumber remaining). Inability of a Supreme Temple Elective Officer to perform the duties of her office and/or neglect of duties.

Page C-34, XIV. SUPREME TEMPLE PENALTIES, add to the list of penalties in the second paragraph of A. to read:

The penalties in the order of severity are Reprimand, Removal of Supreme Office, Suspension, and Expulsion.

Add a new C. REMOVAL FROM SUPREME OFFICE and re-letter SUSPENSION AS D. and EXPULSION AS E.

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C. REMOVAL FROM SUPREME OFFICE

1. The Supreme Queen shall notify the members of the Subordinate Temples of the Supreme Officer's removal from office by the Supreme Temple Hearing Committee.
2. The judgment of the Supreme Temple Hearing Committee shall be recorded in the Minutes of the Supreme Temple in the following manner:
 "As a result of the Supreme Temple Hearing Committee, _____ (Name, Title) was removed from the Supreme Office of _____ by the Supreme Temple Code of Conduct Committee Chair on _____." (Date of Removal)

Page C-35, Re-letter E. to F., to read as follows:

F. JUDGMENT OF CONVICTION AND EFFECTIVE DATE OF PENALTY

1. A Judgment of Conviction by the Supreme Temple Hearing Committee and the penalty imposed by it of either Reprimand, Removal from Supreme Office, Suspension, or Expulsion shall be in effect immediately following notification in writing.
2. A copy of the Hearing Committee's Decision shall be provided to the Supreme Temple Code of Conduct Committee and the Accused.
3. The Decision by the Supreme Temple Hearing Committee is FINAL. There is NO appeal process.
